### Prelim Timetable

A draft copy of the Prelim Timetable was issued to Principal Teachers for review early this week and has now been published in the S4, S5 and S6 Google Classrooms for pupils to review and to support them in planning for these important Assessments.

The dates are Monday 17 January 2022 to Friday 28 January 2022 inclusive.

We have attempted to keep the exam diet to a two-week period to preserve as much learning and teaching time with senior classes as possible. This is a challenging exercise with 66 exams to schedule into ten school days, with six of these days finishing at 2.55pm and many pupils relying on school transport to take them home.

Several pupils will have two exams on the same day, but we have tried to ensure that there are no clashes where two of a pupil's exams are timetabled at the same time.

Anyone who has any questions regarding an exam should speak to their subject teacher who will refer them to their Year Head if necessary.

## Course Choice – Foundation Apprenticeships

Is your son or daughter thinking about studying a Foundation Apprenticeship next year? Do you want to find out more? Skills Development Scotland and National Parents Forum for Scotland have arranged a session on Foundation Apprenticeships for parents and carers on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> December from 7pm-8pm.

This will give you the opportunity to find out about Foundation Apprenticeships including who they are for, how they work and their benefits. During this one-hour session they will talk through the value and equivalency of the qualification in terms of SCQF levels and UCAS points. They will also share pupil journeys and how Foundation Apprenticeships helped them progress onto a job such as a Modern or Graduate Apprenticeship, college, or university. There will also be an opportunity to ask questions at the end.

## Car Parking

As you know from previous communications, we ask families not to use the school car park at the front of the school to drop off or collect young people at the beginning and end of the school day. This reduces congestion and the chance of accidents because the entry points to school for S4 and S5 pupils is located at this side of the school. The preferred drop-off and collection point for pupils is Braehead Way. This gives young people safe access to school grounds. However, we are aware that some families are still using the rear car park – beside the community/swimming pool entrance to the building. This can also lead to problems for pupils and the school buses. The area which must be kept clear for the buses is clearly marked to ensure that pupils can safely board the buses. As many young people who walk home also use the exits at this side of the school and then make their way across therefore cross the car park there is potential for an accident. It would be appreciated if families who are dropping off or collecting their child could plan to do so away from the school, for example on Braehead Way.

Anyone who is collecting a sick child during the school day can use the bays in the school car marked for visitors.

If we have an emergency during the school day and must send young people home early, we will contact parents/carers using Group call messages. Before we send young people home, we ask teachers to check that they have been able to contact home and will be able to get into the house. If any young person has not been able to do this, we ask them to wait in school until we or they have made contact.

We have separate arrangements for our more vulnerable learners who travel to school by taxi whereby one of our support team will telephone parent/carer directly.
