Change of Timetable

Week one is now complete, and any updates or changes required for individual young people's timetables have been made.

We have an approach to timetabling which is time consuming but worthwhile. We take all the choices young people make in the different subjects and create a brandnew bespoke timetable each year based on those choices. Young people's' choices based on their chosen pathways through and beyond school drive the timetable and so their curriculum. This year 100% of young people moving from S2 – S3 got their first choices and 97.1% of young people moving into S4 to S6 got their first choices.

We do our best but sometimes because of limits on class sizes or staffing we are not able to meet 100% of the choices young people make.

The Cost of the School Day

As you know we want to make sure that all young people who attend Bridge of Don Academy feel included in all aspects of school life. Cost should not be a barrier to participation in every aspect of school life for any young person or prevent them from having the same educational and social chances as their peers.

"Education is free but a lot of school things are not." (Member of the Children's Parliament, age 11)¹

As we begin preparations for next session, I can confirm that the following is all in place to ensure that school things have no cost attached at Bridge of Don Academy.

- No charge will be made for any aspect of a course or programme of work a young person is following. This includes no charges being made for materials, consumables, or equipment in practical subjects.
- Young people who are entitled to free school meals can access food items which can be eaten outside of school – so young people can socialise with friends.
- Young people who bring packed lunches can eat these alongside their friends in the canteen no separate areas.
- Uniform has been planned to cost as little as possible whilst keeping young people safe and ensuring that families are not pressurised into buying expensive fashion items for wearing to school.
- Heads of House will have sensitive discussions with families they know well to offer help which will be given sensitively, with a minimum of fuss and in complete confidence.
- Learning boxes including a variety of stationery items are in all teaching areas and young people can access these items freely.
- All trips associated with the curriculum to support learning will be free of charge for all young people.
- We no longer ask young people to bring a £1 on non-uniform days: we are looking at other ways we can raise funds for the school fund.
- Activities Week (S1 S3) is planned to offer a range of trips and activities some of which are free of any cost.
- As with uniform items our Heads of House contact families to discuss sensitively the ways we can support them so their children can participate fully
- All S1 pupils experience the same rolling programme of Activities to ensure equity.
- For pupils in S2 S3 a range of activities will be on offer from those which cost nothing to residential trips which have a higher cost.
- The grants and financial support available to families are highlighted.
- Payment plans are available for residential trips and as much notice as possible is given so families can spread the cost.
- All young people in Scotland have access to free bus transport.

Plans for the future:

- To use the toolkit linked below² to support discussions with staff and pupils about what else we could do to ensure that cost is not a barrier to participation in school life.
- To invite the views of parents and carers on what else we can do: I will issue a questionnaire at the beginning of the new term.
- To ensure young people are given an opportunity to learn about poverty and its impact on families.

Uniform S1 – S4

The details of school uniform are on the school website here. As I have previously intimated the uniform is planned to keep costs as low as possible for families. All items except the school tie can be purchased from shops and outlets of a family's choice.

We understand that washing machines break down and that young people have growth spurts and need new trousers or shoes which puts financial pressure on families. If your child(ren) cannot attend in uniform for a valid reason, please just let the school know. We also understand that fuel costs and unforeseen expenses can put extra pressure on families who may just need help in the short term. Please let us help where we can – contact your child's Head of House directly or just email the school and we will do what we can to support the purchase of appropriate uniform items.

Senior School Uniform

Pupils who have been accepted for return to school in S5 and S6 are expected to wear Senior School uniform, which comprises school blazer, white/black shirt, red senior tie, black trousers/skirt and black shoes.

Our blazers and tie are available from Abstitch in the centre of town. Their address is: 35 Ann St, Aberdeen, AB25 3LH, telephone number 01224 639152. Their opening hours are Monday to Friday from 9am until 4pm.

Blazers are measured to fit and are easily kept. They are light and practical and can be washed at home.

The final collection of the year will be on **Monday 27 June 2022.** Times are challenging for many of our families now because of rising fuel costs and the cost of living so I am aware some of you may not feel able to contribute. But because there

is also an increasing demand for the services of foodbanks for the same reasons it is important to give this chance to contribute to those who feel they can. This is for our own community here in Aberdeen and so whatever you can contribute will, I know, be appreciated by CFINE.
