Covid-19 Mitigations

You will have seen announcements from the Scottish Government that face coverings no longer need to be worn in classrooms **from 28 February 2022**, but are still required when moving around the school and in communal areas such as corridors and in the school canteen when not eating or drinking.

Young people and staff can still wear face covering in classrooms if they wish to do so.

S3 Parents' Evening: Wednesday 23 February 2022

Parents' Evenings for session 2021/2022 will be held online using the same software which has been used by parents and staff in previous years when making appointments. A video calling module is now built into the software which allows meetings to take place within the browser.

For parents who are unfamiliar with the system, a letter will be issued a week before the Parents' Evening. A link will be given to the Parents' Evening Booking System web page which will ask for information to be entered to identify them as the parent/carer of their child. Once logged in, they will be able to make appointments with their child's teachers depending on availability.

On the evening itself, once logged in, parents will see a list of their appointments and a link to click which will automatically start a video call with each of their child's teachers. The call will end after five minutes and the next one will begin a few seconds later.

Times will be available from 4.45pm until 7.30pm, with a 15-minute comfort break at 6.00pm.

More information will be provided to parents when we open the system for bookings next week.

Work for young people self-isolating

I think we have all welcomed the reduction in time that anyone who tests positive for Covid-19 is required to self-isolate. However, for many young people this can still be up to a week of in school learning missed. Work is being provided through Google Classroom for young people who are well enough to work. Please let us know if they have difficulty accessing this because they do not have a suitable device or if there are other issues relating to schoolwork whilst self-isolating.

S4 – S6 SQA Exams: Timetable and Study Leave

The SQA Exam Timetable can be accessed <u>here</u>. On this page there is also a link for young people to create their own individual timetable.

Please note that schools can alter the start times of exams by up to 30 minutes to allow for local circumstances so young people should not use the times of the exams as published on the SQA website. All young people will be issued with a personalised exam timetable detailing the times (for this school) as well as the room number and seat number for each of the exams they are sitting at an assembly led by Mr Jamieson. They will be given time to check this which will also include the name to go on their certificate and the address to which their certificate will be sent. Any errors must be brought to our attention so they can be changed.

Young people can also sign up to have their results sent by text message or by email. Young people must sign up to *MySQA* for this service and can do that <u>here</u>.

Study leave is for all S4 – S6 young people and will begin on Tuesday 26 April 2022. Therefore, their last day in school will be Monday 25 April.

Course Choice Procedures

Course Choice procedures are well under way for the current S2 to S5 Pupils. Information was issued in previous Head Teacher update letters issued Friday 21 and 28 January and can be read on the school website here.


