I hope the half term holiday was a good opportunity for young people to recharge their batteries. It is not a long break, but I am sure it is welcome in the longest term of the session. On the In-service Days teachers focussed on moderation of the National Qualifications by working with colleagues across the city. This is an important part of our Quality Assurance procedures to ensure that the correct standards are being applied across all our city schools when making judgements about young people's attainment in their National Qualification courses.

Wellbeing

It is hard to believe it is almost two years since we entered lockdown: working and learning from home and a world dominated by bulletins full of Covid-19 statistics, mitigations and restrictions impacting on all aspects of our lives and very real fears about the health and wellbeing of those we love. For some we are all too aware that life has been changed forever by this pandemic and it continues to impact on the wellbeing of individuals and families in different ways. Fortunately, we seem to be entering a phase where our minds and energy can now turn to planning for the long term rather than just focussing on the next announcement of change from the Scottish Government, local authority or the SQA.

As you will know from previous communications the local authority is gathering the views of young people about their own wellbeing in its broadest sense. Their views will be gathered using questionnaires and we will be able to share the results with you, staff, and the young people next term. Following discussions through PSE lessons and focus groups we will then be able to plan together – teachers, pupils, and parents/carers how best to support their learning and wellbeing as we move into next session – and what we need to prioritise.

Your views on how we can collectively support our young people's wellbeing are vital as we begin this planning process. The first step will be for me to raise this at the next Parent Council meeting which takes place on **Tuesday 22 February at 19.30** through Microsoft Teams. I will be looking for the Parent Council members to share with me their views and then we need to plan together how together how to gather the ideas and views of the wider parent/carer body.

S3 Parents' Evening: Wednesday 23 February 2022

Parents' Evenings for session 2021/2022 will be held online using the same software which has been used by parents and staff in previous years when making appointments. A video calling module is now built into the software which allows meetings to take place within the browser.

For parents who are unfamiliar with the system, a letter and instructions were issued to parents on Thursday this week. The system was opened up at 7pm that evening for parents/carers to schedule appointments with their child's teachers.

On the evening itself, once logged in, parents will see a list of their appointments and a link to click which will automatically start a video call with each of their child's teachers. The call will end after five minutes and the next one will begin a few seconds later.

Times will be available from 4.45pm until 7.30pm, with a 15-minute comfort break at 6.00pm.

S4 – S6 SQA Exams: Timetable and Study Leave

Please note that schools can alter the start times of exams by up to 30 minutes to allow for local circumstances so young people should not use the times of the exams as published on the SQA website. All young people will be issued with a personalised exam timetable detailing the times (for this school) as well as the room number and seat number for each of the exams they are sitting at an assembly led by Mr Jamieson. They will be given time to check this which will also include the name to go on their certificate and the address to which their certificate will be sent. Any errors must be brought to our attention so they can be changed.

Young people can also sign up to have their results sent by text message or by email. Young people must sign up to *MySQA* for this service and can do that <u>here</u>.

Study leave is for all S4 – S6 young people and will begin on Tuesday 26 April 2022. Therefore, their last day in school will be Monday 25 April.

Course Choice Procedures

Severe Weather

My thanks to staff, families, and young people for the quick and efficient way they responded to the need to close the school early on Friday 18 February 2022. This was because of the road conditions in outlying areas and the need to ensure all pupils and staff could get home safely. Although conditions in Bridge of Don did not deteriorate as much as in other parts of the city and outlying areas our assessment of the situation was that travel conditions were such that there could have been significant delays and safety concerns for pupil and staff journeys home if we had not closed early.

We have in place policies to ensure learning can continue when we have periods of bad weather.

All classwork and homework are posted on Google Classroom as assignments so parents/carers can see this using Google Guardian. Before we send young people home, we ask teachers to check that they have been able to contact home and will be able to get into the house. If any young person has not been able to do this, we ask them to wait in school until we or they have made contact.

We have separate arrangements for our more vulnerable learners who travel to school by taxi whereby one of our support team will telephone parent/carer directly.


