SQA Exams and Study Leave S4 – S6

Mr Jamieson, Depute Head Teacher has issued a letter to all families detailing expectations of young people sitting National Qualification examinations starting next week. This can be accessed on the school website here.

Please note that we have changed the times of exams as published by the SQA to be in line with our school day.

As well as explaining study leave and the exams this also contains information about the results service and post-results service the SQA provide for young people.

Face Coverings

On Monday I sent out an update about changes to the requirement for face coverings in school. This brings schools into line with wider society where the requirement for face coverings is now advisory (to be encouraged) rather than mandatory or governed by law. I am sure this will be a welcome change for most staff and young people. Anyone who wishes to continue wearing a face covering in class or communal areas will be supported to do so.

Parent Council

The next meeting will be online using Microsoft Teams on **Tuesday 26 April 2022 at 19.30** and will be a continuation of this discussion focusing on Learning, Teaching and Assessment, Wellbeing and Employability.

The Parent Council would like to invite any parent or carer to come along – even if you are only able to come to this meeting. All you need to do is email the school with your name and the name of your child(ren) and give us an email address for the invite.

It is a warm and welcoming group: the parents and carers who attend do so because they want to support the school but also because they want to find out more about how things work in education today and how they can support their children's learning and wellbeing.

Information from Police Scotland and Grampian Fire and Rescue

We have been contacted by Police Scotland and the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service asking us to do what we can to inform young people about the very serious potential hazards of accessing buildings which are not in use currently and have been boarded up.

We can all well imagine the dangers of such activities. Recently the Police and Fire services have had to deal with a high frequency of incidents at one such building in the Bridge of Don area. They have had information that young people have been accessing this building and lighting fires – not to vandalise but as a source of warmth to support social gatherings.

The landlords have been contacted and asked to make the building more secure but in the meantime the police have asked us as a school community to do what we can to stop this and protect young people from potentially serious harm. I am not going to talk to all pupils in assemblies because that has the potential to create curiosity in some who are not currently involved and could make the problem worse. However, the Fire and Rescue Service have volunteered to come into school to talk in general about fire safety in the community which will cover this too.

It is important that you are made aware of this so that if you have concerns you can address these with your own children and young people. The Police have indicated that because of the lack of ventilation anyone in the building at a time when fires have been lit would inevitably smell strongly of smoke. In addition, if you have any information which would help identify those involved, please pass it on in order that they can be spoken to directly regarding the dangers and potential risks to themselves and their friends.

Any information you pass on to me will be treated in confidence and young people not made aware of the sources.

Extra-Curricular Update

Details about the NHS Grampian offer of two new free online programmes from their partners SilverCloud: *Supporting an Anxious Child* and *Supporting an Anxious Teen* were sent home by email on Friday 1 April 2022. Using tried-and-tested, evidence-based approaches, both courses have been designed by experts to help parents, carers, and teachers — or any adults in a caring role — to support children and young people who are struggling with anxiety. We have been asked not to share the contact details on any social media platforms because there is a different contact for each Health Board area in Scotland.
