## **Covid Mitigations**

## Wellbeing

The Parent Council met on Tuesday 22 February 2022 and discussed how best to gather the views of the wider parent body on how we work together to support young people's wellbeing.

The general discussion was that as restrictions are lifted the aspects of school that enhance young people's enjoyment and support their skills development and learning will be possible. We spoke about the benefits of school trips and excursions; school shows and concerts and sporting events and competitions that support positive relationships between staff and pupils and between young people.

You are already aware of the wellbeing questionnaires that young people will be completing which will give us rich data about where we need to focus our efforts in the next few months and years.

The parent council are keen to gather the views of other parents and carers, and how to do this will be the main topic for the next meeting which takes place on **Tuesday 29 March at 19.00 in person in school**. The Parent Council would like to warmly invite any parent or carer who would like to attend to come along – even if only for this meeting. All you need to do is email the school with your name and the name of your child(ren).

The Parent Councill will revert to online meetings for the rest of this session but plan two face-to-face meetings each year at the beginning of the new session in September and at the end of the Spring term in March.

## S2 Parents' Evening: Wednesday 9 March 2022

The S2 Parents' Evenings will be held online using the same software which has been used by parents and staff in previous years to make appointments. A video calling module is now built into the software which allows meetings to take place within a browser.

For parents who are unfamiliar with the system, a letter will be issued a week before the Parents' Evening. A link will be given to the Parents' Evening Booking System web page which will ask for information to be entered to identify them as the parent/carer of their child. Once logged in, they will be able to make appointments with their child's teachers depending on availability.

On the evening itself, once logged in, parents will see a list of their appointments and a link to click which will automatically start a video call with each of their child's teachers. The call will end after five minutes and the next one will begin a few seconds later.

Times will be available from 4.45pm until 7.30pm, with a 15-minute comfort break at 6.00pm. It is important to note that this allows 30 five-minute slots for teachers to speak with parent/carers. However, some teachers may have more than one class, which means it won't be possible for them to meet with the parent/carer of every young person they teach. We apologise if you are unable to secure an appointment with a teacher but would ask you to contact your child's Guidance Teacher if you wish to receive feedback on their progress.

More information will be provided to parents via Groupcall before we open the system for bookings next week.

#### **Course Choice Procedures**

Course Choice procedures are completed for most of our young people. Work will continue with those that require additional support to do this.

The deadline for handing in course choice forms has been extended to Friday 4 March for all S4 – S6 pupils.

Many of the senior pupils have applied to undertake a City Campus course or a School Links College course. These courses require the young person to complete an online application form to be considered for the course. The Guidance team will be supporting young people in PSE to do this. The deadline for these applications is 18 March 2022.

The forms that they require to complete are available in Google Classroom.

Mrs Cruickshank would like to express her thanks to parents/carers for all of their help and support to our young people during their course choice procedures.

#### **Severe Weather**

We have in place policies to ensure learning can continue when we have periods of bad weather.

All classwork and homework are posted on Google Classroom as assignments so parents/carers can see this using Google Guardian. 
