Revised Government Guidance for Schools

This came into schools on Thursday 17 March. The full guidance can be accessed here. As I explained last week Head Teachers and Officers from Aberdeen City Council will be going through this, updating our risk assessments, and issuing these in time for 18 April when we return for the summer term. In the meantime, Jason Leitch, National Clinical Director has issued a letter to all families (sent by email)

explaining these changes, detailing the routine protective measures that will remain in place and explaining why the asymptomatic testing programme is coming to an end. This letter can also be accessed on the school website <u>here</u>. Apart from an end to the routine asymptomatic testing programme we are expected to maintain the mitigations currently in place:

- Young people and staff should stay at home and self-isolate if they have symptoms of Covid-19
- Good hand hygiene to be maintained
- Cleaning routines maintained
- Ventilation to be a priority
- Face coverings for staff and pupils in corridors and communal areas such as the canteen when not eating, unless exempt
- Physical distancing, as a reasonable precaution between staff and between staff and pupils 1m is the recommendation
- Face coverings on school transport unless exempt

We appreciate all of you sending your child(ren) to school with appropriate face coverings. We will continue with separate entrances for each year group so that we can welcome young people to school each day, supply spare face coverings if required and ensure hands are sanitised. This will not apply to S4 – S6 pupils during exams: they should use the main entrance.

LFD Test Packs

We still have a number of these in school which will be available for young people to collect from either the school office or Heads of House. We will no longer be distributing them after the holidays because as detailed above the asymptomatic testing programme is coming to an end.

S4 - S6 Reports

Just a reminder that we are extending the deadline for completion of the reports by teachers to 1 April and these will be issued to families after the holidays, by Friday 22 April. This will ensure that the estimate grades in the reports are based on the latest and best evidence produced by the young people so will be up to date. These will be the estimate grades which will be sent to the SQA.

SQA Assemblies

Assemblies for young people in S4 – S6 will focus on the forthcoming SQA Examinations and the regulations governing them including the following:

- Conduct
- Items not allowed in exam rooms

- The role of Invigilators
- What to do if you are late or ill during and exam

Mr Jamieson will also issue each young person with the following:

- A summary of the courses they are entered for to check for accuracy
- The contact details we have on the system which is where exam certificates will be sent to check for accuracy and confirmation of the name which will appear on exam certificates.

In addition, a booklet produced by the SQA will be issued to each young person detailing the above and other rules set by the SQA. It contains the small tear-out card on which young people can record their Scottish Candidate Number (SCN) which must be written on all exam papers. This is the only item, apart from pens and a clear unlabelled water bottle which can be taken into the exam room. Much of this information can be viewed <u>here</u>

The year groups are large and so will be split to be accommodated comfortably in the Assembly Room.

If time allows, we will also take this opportunity to tell our seniors about the opportunities open to them to take on leadership roles through the Head Team, Prefect system, Buddies' team, mentors and our extra -curricular programme as they move into S5 and S6.

Study Leave will begin for all on Tuesday 25 April. A letter from the school reminding young people about the exam procedures discussed at Assemblies will follow over the next few weeks and a copy e-mailed home.

Parent Council

As you know the parent council are keen to gather the views of other parents and carers as we plan for the future, and how to do this will be the main topic for the next meeting which takes place on **Tuesday 29 March at 19.00 in person in school**. The Parent Council would like to warmly invite any parent or carer who would like to attend to come along – even if only for this meeting. All you need to do is email the school with your name and the name of your child(ren).

The Parent Councill will revert to online meetings for the meetings in April, May and June but plan two face-to-face meetings each year. At the beginning of the new session in September and at the end of the Spring term in March the meetings will be face-to-face.

Transport Scotland's Pass Collect app

If you are aged between 16 and 21 and already have an active NEC or Young Scot NEC you can download your free bus travel using the Transport Scot Pass Collect app onto your mobile phone.

Active cards are those received since 2016 – they'll have a long number next to the ITSO logo and, if there's a date of birth shown, it will be highlighted with a pink strip. Please note, any NECs which are dedicated matriculation cards aren't compatible with the app.



Download the Transport Scot Pass Collect app on the App Store or Google Play to add free bus travel your existing card:



How to download the app

You can use the app with an Android (version 6 or later) or iOS (version 6 or later) phone that is connected to the internet by Wi-Fi or mobile connection. The phone must have Near Field Communication (NFC) compatibility. This is the same function you use for mobile contactless payments and is usually available on newer smartphones. To download the app you will need to either be connected to Wi-Fi, or have 3G, 4G or 5G network connection with good mobile signal.

How to use the app
