November In-Service Day: Friday 19 November 2021

## S4 to S6 Online Parents' Evenings

Our first Parents' Evening this session is for S4 to S6 pupils and offers two dates, Wednesday 10 November and Thursday 18 November. Times will be available from 4.45pm until 7.25pm, with a 15-minute comfort break built-in at 6.00pm.

Parents' Evenings for session 2021/2022 will be held online using the same software which has been used by parents and staff in previous years when making appointments. A video calling module is now built into the software which allows meetings to take place within the browser.

A letter and instruction sheet will be sent out on Monday via Group call and we will open the system for bookings on Tuesday evening at 7pm.

For parents who are unfamiliar with the system, the letter will provide a link to the Parents' Evening Booking System webpage, which will then ask for information to be entered to identify them as the parent/carer of their child. Once logged in, they will be able to make appointments with their child's teachers as detailed in the instructions.

On the evening itself, after logged in, parents/carers will see a list of their appointments and a link to click which will automatically start a video call with each of their child's teachers. The call will end after five minutes and the next one will begin right away.

## S4 to S6 Study Support

We are currently working on several supports for young people in our senior phase to help them to prepare for the assessments and examinations for their courses and also to support their planning for the future.

Class teachers have been assessing the progress of young people and reports were posted home at the end of last term. A letter accompanying the reports explained their content. Any questions arising from this report can be asked at the Parents Evenings as detailed above.

These reports will be reviewed by senior staff together with Heads of House and Principal Teachers of the Faculties. This will allow us to identify young people who may need additional support or interventions.

Study skills and approaches to revision will be covered by our Heads of House in PSE lessons and specific subject related revision approaches and advice will be covered by teachers in classes. In PSE the following will be covered over the course of this term:

- Creating individual, bespoke Revision Timetables.
- RGU talks on Note talking for S5 and S6
- Reinforcing Revision Booklet
- Presentation on growth mindsets, marginal gains, and work ethic
- Revision and study techniques with examples of specific approaches which will be helpful particularly for S4.
- One to one conversations with individuals to discuss how they are feeling as we approach the Estimates. Identifying areas of concern to respond, support and advise accordingly.
- Advice on looking after themselves and promoting positive mental health and wellbeing
- All to be sprinkled with a positive can-do attitude and ability to take responsibility for their own learning as they enter and leave the room!

 All classes will end in the last week of term with Christmas themed lesson on memory skills. Heads of House are creating activities and games for this which will hopefully be fun but also recap and reinforce some of the content covered and help develop memory skills.

## **Cop26 Survey of Young People**

A slide show and survey have been posted in all year group Google Classrooms for young people to complete. Young people in S1 - S4 will complete this during their time in social studies in week beginning 1 November 2021 and young people in S5 and S6 when they are in study. All young people in Aberdeen's schools have been asked to do this. The purpose of the survey is for officers, officials and councillors to hear the ideas of our pupils, but also to gauge their knowledge and understanding of both COP 26 and NET ZERO so that we have benchmark data that hopefully we can improve on in the years to come. Please note the survey is embedded in the slideshow and young people should work their way through the slides before completing the survey at the end.
