#### Parents' Evenings and Reporting

At the end of this letter, I have included a schedule for these with brief explanations of the purpose of each event. Following the guidance from the Scottish Government the plan is for schools to hold virtual parents' evenings and not face to face in-school events. There will be more information coming out about how this will work for parents and carers: I believe the software is straightforward and works well and supports both staff and parents/carers to stick to the five-minute appointment time slots allocated.

#### Winter Coats: Help Available For Families

As August ended there was a definite Autumnal nip in the air and your thoughts may well be turning to the need to provide a winter coat for your child(ren). I want to draw your attention to a <u>source of help</u> with this which we can help you to apply for. If you are worried about not being able to afford to buy your child(ren) a coat suitable for a north-east winter – which can last a long time – please contact your child's Guidance Teacher and we can apply on your behalf. You could receive a £50 Primark voucher which would be enough to buy a warm coat.

#### Mission Christmas (Northsound Appeal 2021)

Sorry for mentioning Christmas so early this term but we wanted to bring this to your attention as soon as possible. Using this <u>link</u> you can find out more about this worthwhile appeal and might wish to donate! We have a long tradition in this school

of supporting families throughout the year but also at what can be a very challenging time of year. We apply on behalf of a family and are given gift items to pass on to parents/carers, suitable, for the age of the young people applied for. We do this with the agreement and support of families and do everything to make it as straightforward as possible for parents and carers to be able to give these gifts to their children from themselves or from the man in the red suit!

#### **Covid-19 and Challenging Family Circumstances**

We are very conscious that covid-19 has had a much wider impact on our families than the challenges of home schooling, working from home and the mitigations in place since our return to school. We know that the downturn in the local economy has had an impact on employment in a number of industries which will have resulted in under-employment, unemployment, redundancies and more zero hours contracts. We know that there have been glimmers of hope as more contracts have been secured by the energy sector which means fewer families may be living with the threat of redundancy and that as hospitality has opened there are encouraging signs of employment opportunities increasing in this sector. However, we also know that there have been many challenges in importing resources needed by the construction industry which means contracts cannot be fulfilled which also has an impact on security of employment.

We are very aware that this impacts on family incomes and we want to help where we can. As well as drawing parents and carers attention to sources of help like those detailed above, we do have access to funds which can support young people to make life in school easier when their family is experiencing either long- or shortterm financial hardship. As always, the first point of contact is your child's guidance teacher/Head of House. Please be assured that if you make contact, we will respect your privacy and be sensitive to the family's circumstances.

#### **Parent Council**

The Parent Council met on Tuesday 31 August 2021. This group of parents and carers meets once per month throughout the school year. The following are their objectives:

- To work in partnership with the school to create a welcoming school which is inclusive for all parents.
- To promote partnership between the school, its pupils, and its parents.
- To develop and engage in activities which support the education and welfare of the pupils.
- To identify and represent the views of parents on the education provided by the school and other matters affecting the education and welfare of the pupils.

They would like to ensure we have representation across all the year groups and especially our new S1 parents and carers. All meetings are taking place remotely through Microsoft Teams from 19.30 - 20.30 on the last Tuesday of the month as

#### Covid-19 Vaccinations for 16 and 17-year-olds

There are a number of options for young people and indeed anyone aged over 18 years who has still to get their first or second dose of the Covid-19 vaccine. The city has several clinics for drop-ins and options for appointment booking. P&J Live: Anyone over 16 years can drop-in for both first and second dose (Second dose must be at least 8 weeks after first) - Monday to Sunday, 9am – 6pm.

#### **Autumn Flu Vaccination Programme**

The local authority and the NHS have set dates for the flu vaccination programme which will take place in schools. Our allocated dates are 4, 5 and 6 October. All forms were due to be returned on Friday 3 September if you would still like your child(ren) to have a flu vaccination please return the form by Monday at the latest.

#### **Lateral Flow Testing**

Taking a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) test, ideally twice a week, helps with early detection of cases of Covid-19. LFD kits are available from school and following completion of the following can be issued to pupils though PSE.
