Wellbeing Surveys

You will recall that I mentioned these in last week's update letter. These will give us valuable information about young people so we can plan how to support them with their learning and wellbeing.

The two surveys we are doing are taking place across the school in PSE week beginning 7 March 2022 and week beginning 14 March 2022. S6 is the exception, they did one yesterday Thursday 3 March as we have a speaker for S6 next week.

Parent Council

The wellbeing surveys detailed above will give us rich data about where we need to focus our efforts in the next few months and years.

The parent council are keen to gather the views of other parents and carers, and how to do this will be the main topic for the next meeting which takes place on **Tuesday 29 March at 19.00 in person in school**. The Parent Council would like to warmly invite any parent or carer who would like to attend to come along – even if only for this meeting. All you need to do is email the school with your name and the name of your child(ren).

The Parent Councill will revert to online meetings for the rest of this session but plan two face-to-face meetings each year at the beginning of the new session in September and at the end of the Spring term in March.

S2 Parents' Evening: Wednesday 9 March 2022

Parents' Evenings for session 2021/2022 will be held online using the same software which has been used by parents and staff in previous years when making appointments. A video calling module is now built into the software which allows meetings to take place within the browser.

For parents who are unfamiliar with the system, a letter and instructions were issued to parents on Thursday this week. The system was opened up at 7pm that evening for parents to schedule appointments with teachers.

On the evening itself, once logged in, parents will see a list of their appointments and a link to automatically start a video call with each of the teachers. The call will end after five minutes and the next one will begin a few seconds later.

Times will be available from 4.45pm until 7.30pm, with a 15-minute comfort break at 6.00pm.

If you wish to speak to your child's Guidance Teacher about their progress, or if you have any questions about future pathways, please do not hesitate to contact them in school.

School Football

For the first time in two years, school football is back!

S2

Our S2 team travelled to Lochside Academy to take on their B team in a friendly. The boys started the game with intensity and dictated the play from start to finish. This was a good chance for the S2s to get a game under their belt and start to gel as a team for the games to come. All boys represented the school with class and showed respect through the full duration of the event.

Seniors

Our senior boys team kicked off their season with a challenging contest against Cults Academy. In previous years, this has been a tight game with the score going all the way. This was the first league game of the season and the seniors wanted to get off on the right foot. The seniors from start to finish dominated the game, demonstrating teamwork and motivation to work together. There was some exceptional play on show with a variety of goals scored. There was a great turn out from fellow pupils, parents and guardians which gave the seniors added motivation to keep up the intensity. In the end, seniors ran away with a convincing victory and the 3 points. Next up, Albyn School.

In all cases young people who want to represent the school at events such as these must comply with school uniform in school.

Course Choice Procedures

All forms should now have been completed and handed in. If there are any further queries pupils should arrange to see their Guidance in the first instance.

Once we are certain that all Choice forms are completed and handed if, Mrs Cruickshank will work on creating the column structure and thereafter the timetable. There may be instances that some classes may not be able to run due to staffing capacity or low pupil numbers. If this is the case, your child may be asked to consider one of their reserve choices. Both parent/carer and child will be kept up to date with information throughout the process. We do aim to provide pupils with as many of their choices as possible, but we cannot guarantee that everyone will get all their first choices.

A reminder that those pupils who have applied for a School Links College course or a City Campus course must complete the relevant Google Application form. This has been discussed in PSE and pupils can access the link for these in Google Classroom. The deadline for these applications is **18 March 2022**.


