**Faculty Subjects**

In S4 you will continue to study Maths (4 periods per week), English (4 periods per week), PE (2 periods per week), RMPS (1 period per week), PSE (1 period per week). You can choose 4 other subjects, ideally a continuation from the courses that you studied in S3, as this will have given you the foundations to the N5/4 courses.

**Curricular Pathways**

It is important to think carefully about your choices because we would expect you to carry almost all of your subjects forward into your senior phase (S4, S5 & S6). It is strongly encouraged that you will continue with these subjects into S4 to give you the best chance of success in exams. This will give you at least 2 years of learning in your chosen subjects. It is really important to have discussions at home and with your teachers in school to find the best pathway for you.
